

INVINCIBELLE LIMETTA® (H. a. 'NCHA8' ppaf, cbraf)

A beautiful rounded dwarf variety with dark green leaves and showy round flower heads that emerge a lush lime green, lighten to soft greenish-white, then age to green again. The stiff stems and dwarf habit will make growers, retailers, and gardeners very happy. Native.

A whole new color for smooth hydrangea. This dwarf rounded plant has dark green leaves and showy, mauve-purple mophead flowers. Native.

The foliage is extra dark and the stems are strong, ensuring outstanding performance in the container as well as in the garden. It is a strong rebloomer and can be cycle-pruned to deliver multiple shipments of budded plants to the garden center. We recommend selling this plant in 2 gallon pots or larger. Native. This hydrangea grows from Manitoba to Mobile, blooming every year from midsummer to frost. It is a strong rebloomer and can be cycle-pruned to deliver multiple shipments of budded plants to the garden center. We recommend selling this plant in 2 gallon pots or larger. Hydrangea involucrata • Bracted Hydrangea

Family: Hydrangaceae (involucr-ata: Latin for envelope or wrapper, referring to the inflorescence)

BLUE BUNNYTM (H. i. 'Wim Rutten' pp#21,991)

Everyone who sees this unique variety in our trial gardens falls in love with it. A drift of blue flowers from mid-summer until fall! Developed by the late Wim Rutten of the Netherlands, this plant is as special as the man. This strong grower blooms on new wood, reliably and abundantly each year.

Family: Hydrangaceae (macro-phyll-a: large leafed)

These colorful consumer favorites fly off the bench at garden centers! Bold, bright flowers may be mophead (full and spherical) or lacecap (flat and starry). Add aluminum sulfate to growing media to encourage lavender to blue flowers; alkaline soils and untreated growing media will produce pink-red ones. Bigleaf hydrangeas are fast and easy to grow, though we recommend that commercial growers cease fertilization in August and run the plants on the dry side so they harden off for winter.

ABRACADABRA® Star (H. m. 'HorAbstra' pp#21,636)

EDGY® Hearts (H. m. 'Horheart' pp#22,368)



Family: Hydrangaceae (panicul-ata: panicle-like, referring to the shape of the inflorescence)




Little QUICK FIRE® (H. p. 'SMHPLQF' pp#25,136, cbr#5406)

It has the same early bloom time as the original Quick Fire® hydrangea, but this dwarf plant is about one-third the size. The flowers quickly age to a deep burgundy red before other varieties start to flower. The compact habit gives it wonderful container presentation at retail, and also makes it a good choice for patio planters.

The flowers are held upright on thick, rigid stems. Makes a spectacular specimen or flowering hedge. Dr. Johan Van Huylenbroeck developed this beauty at the Flemish ILVO breeding station. 



Just as The Great Gatsby is a classic of American literature, H. quercifolia is a classic native plant. Long prized by savvy gardeners, it's time to bring this intriguing North American beauty to a wider market.



GATSBY GAL® (*H. q.* 'Brenhill' pp#25,106, cbr#5304)

An elegant, compact oakleaf with lots of impressively large flowers. Full panicles of pure white blooms are held upright above the foliage, and are quite large relative to the plant's compact size, making it an ideal choice for smaller gardens. Native.*







Hydrangea serrata • Mountain Hydrangea

Family: Hydrangaceae (serrat-a: serrated or toothed, referring to the leaves)

H. serrata is native to mountainous regions of Asia and Japan, and is better suited to cold conditions than its close relative *H. macrophylla*, which is native to milder coastal regions. We have liked *H. serrata* for years because of its improved bud hardiness, but Tuff Stuff™ hydrangeas up the ante further: they rebloom.

Tiny TUFF STUFF[™] (H. s. 'MAKD' pp#24,842, cbr#5125)

This is a real beauty, with flowers so delicate and refined that it seems strange to call them tough. But they are. Extremely bud-hardy, this rebloomer reliably produces abundant lacecap flowers comprised of doubled sepals. While this plant leans blue, the flower color may range from blue to pink.

TUFF STUFF[™] (*H. s.* 'MAK20' pp#24,820, cbr#4527)

Our hydrangea breeding goal was to deliver improved bud and stem hardiness in addition to the ability to flower on new wood. This serrata delivers on both accounts. Its attractive, reddish-pink, lacecap flowers create a mass of color in early summer. It continues to produce new buds and flowers right up until frost. The amount of any local, state or federal tax levied on the goods is not charged by Spring Meadow due to its agricultural designation and shall remain the sole responsibility of Buyer. Packing and shipping charges are not included in the prices and will be added to the invoice at the time of shipment. Cash in advance accounts will prepay the packing/shipping charge. If actual shipping charges exceed our estimate, Buyer will be responsible for all additional charges incurred. Effective 7/1/2012 Buyer agrees that Buyer will not sell wholesale any Proven Winners® ColorChoice® finished plants at prices less than the Quality Standard Pricing that Spring Meadow assigns to its products from time to time. - 5. <u>CASH IN ADVANCE ACCOUNTS; VISA AND MASTERCARD ACCOUNTS.</u> A 25% deposit is encouraged for all credit card (Visa, Master Card) and cash in advance orders. Although the deposit is not required, inventory will be allocated first to customers who have set up 2% 10 NET 30 terms, then to orders with a deposit in place. Payment in full must be received 30 days prior to shipping date; credit cards will be charged in full 30 days prior to shipping. Cancelled orders may be charged a processing and/or restocking fee. Freight and packaging for credit card orders will be charged upon shipment.
- 6. SHIPPING AND DELIVERY. All shipments are FOB Spring Meadow's place of business, and all risk of loss and damage to the goods passes to Buyer upon delivery of goods to the common carrier. Any dates or schedules that are specified for delivery of services or goods are stated only approximately, calculated from the date of receipt of Buyer's order. All plant varieties are not available for fall or dormant winter/spring shipment. Spring Meadow will attempt to deliver plants as close as possible to a requested ship date, but reserves the right to adjust the shipping date based on the quality and readiness of the plants. Each tray of plants is boxed, stacked on pallets or racked, and then stretchwrapped, or netted together as one shipping unit. Palletized or racked shipments are normally a better value than FedEx if Buyer's order exceeds 15 trays. Buyer must notify us in advance if unable to accept a pallet shipment. Spring Meadow ships FedEx in custom designed boxes. Four trays per box, specially packed in an upright position travel to Buyer's door.
- 7. <u>SHIPPING DAMAGES CLAIMS.</u> All shipping damages must be noted at the time of receipt of goods from the carrier. Any box breakage or other obvious damages must be noted in writing on the carrier's bills of lading. Claim forms are available from the carrier.
- 8. <u>FORCE MAJEURE.</u> Spring Meadow shall not be responsible or liable for any delays in service completion due to any cause or condition beyond its control, including, without limitation, fire, flood, earthquake, labor dispute, shortage of materials or supplies, riot or other civil disturbance, war, acts of God or nature, accident, or any acts of any government.

- 9. PROVEN WINNERS® COLORCHOICE® FEES. Proven Winners® ColorChoice® fees are collected to cover patent, trademark, breeder, brand and marketing costs in addition to the listed plant price. Proven Winners® ColorChoice® fees are subject to change without notice.
- 10. PROVEN WINNERS BRAND. Upon the purchase of any patented or trademarked plants from Spring Meadow, Buyer agrees to the following: (a) To purchase and affix the trademark and/or patent tag, which properly identifies the plant, to each plant sold. (b) To clearly identify proper plant names including plant patent numbers and trademark names in all sales literature. (c) To feature the Proven Winners® ColorChoice® branded product line and not affix other branded tags or co-brand with any other brand. (d) To not propagate or aid in the illegal propagation of any Proven Winners® ColorChoice® plant without a license. (e) To sell Proven Winners® ColorChoice® plants in approved Proven Winners® ColorChoice® branded containers. - 11. <u>LIMITED WARRANTY.</u> Spring Meadow warrants its plants to be true to name, to be inspected by the Michigan Department of Agriculture and certified to be apparently free of dangerous insects and dangerously contagious plant diseases, and to be in good living condition at the time of delivery to the common carrier. Buyer's remedy is limited, in the sole discretion of Spring Meadow, to replacement of any plants determined to be defective and covered by this limited warranty. Replacement plant material will be provided as soon as production plans permit and will be shipped by Spring Meadow at no cost to Buyer.
- 12. EXCLUSION OF OTHER WARRANTIES. THE LIMITED WARRANTY STATED ABOVE IS IN LIEU OF ALL OTHER WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, AND SPRING MEADOW HEREBY EXPRESSLY DISCLAIMS ANY AND ALL OTHER WARRANTIES OF ANY KIND OR NATURE, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION ANY IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY, FITNESS FOR ANY PARTICULAR PURPOSE, OR FUTURE GROWTH. NO WARRANTIES OR REPRESENTATIONS MADE AT ANY TIME BY ANY REPRESENTATIVE OF SPRING MEADOW SHALL BE EFFECTIVE TO VARY OR EXTEND THE LIMITED WARRANTY OR OTHER TERMS.
- 13. <u>LIMITATION OF CLAIMS FOR DEFECTIVE PLANTS.</u> No plant claims covered by the limited warranty may be brought against Spring Meadow more than ten (10) days after shipment. Claim notification must be in writing. No claims will be paid on plants shipped while dormant.
- 14. <u>LIMITATION ON LIABILITY:</u> Under no circumstance shall Spring Meadow's liability to Buyer exceed the value of this agreement. Under no circumstances, whether arising in contract, tort, equity or otherwise, shall Spring Meadow be liable for consequential, incidental or special damages (including loss of use, lost profits, increased operating or maintenance expense), related to the provision of services or goods.
- 15. <u>APPLICABLE LAW:</u> This agreement shall be deemed made in Ottawa County, Michigan and shall be governed by Michigan law without regard to its conflict of laws principles.
- 16. <u>DISPUTE RESOLUTION:</u> Any action arising out of it shall be governed by Michigan law and shall be brought in the District or Circuit Court for Ottawa County or in the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Michigan. Buyer consents that such courts shall have personal jurisdiction over Buyer as to any such action and that the mailing of any process to Buyer's last known address by registered mail shall constitute lawful and valid service of process.
- 17. <u>MISCELLANEOUS</u>: All notices shall be provided to the addresses set forth in this agreement and if none is provided, to the party's resident. Wherever possible, all terms shall be interpreted consistently. If a conflict arises as to price, payment or delivery, the typed terms on the front page shall control over printed provisions on this side. For any other conflict, these Terms and Conditions shall control. No usage in trade shall create a conflict with these terms. Spring Meadow reserves the right to correct any typographical error in this Agreement. If any provision is determined to be unenforceable, the remainder of this agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
- 18. ENTIRE AGREEMENT AND AMENDMENT: This agreement contains all of the terms of the agreement between Spring Meadow and Buyer as to its subject matter and supersedes all prior oral or written representations, agreements, and other communications between Spring Meadow and Buyer. This agreement may be amended only by a writing signed by Spring Meadow and an officer of Buyer.
