

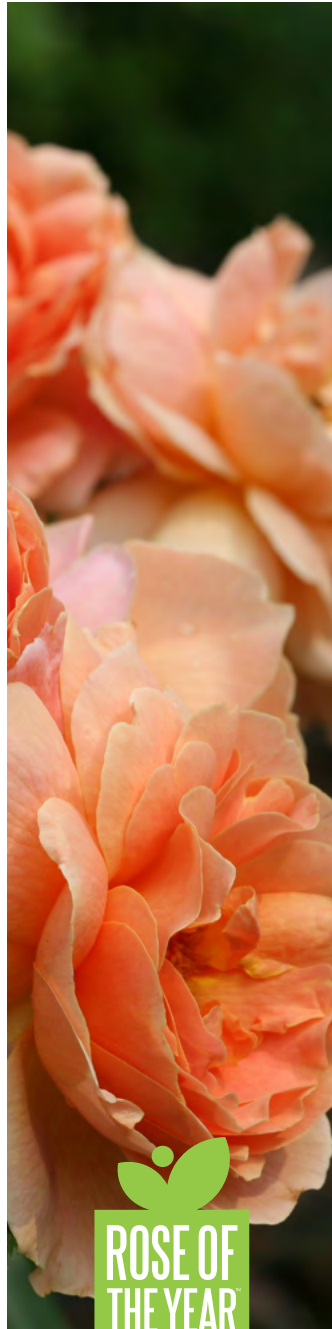

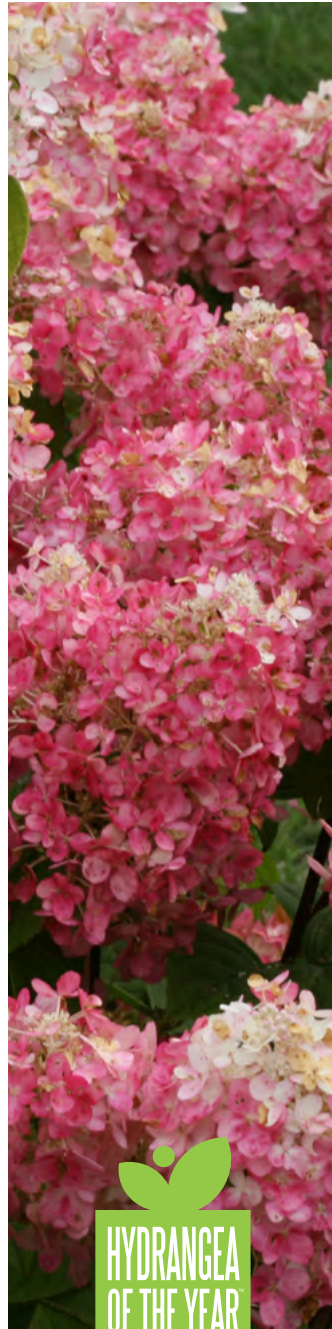

Durable native groundcover shrub

Looking for a replacement for *Rhus* 'Gro-Low'? Check out this remarkable new dwarf *Aronia*. White spring flowers are just the start of the show: glossy green foliage turns brilliant red in fall, and black fruit are quite ornamental. Quite possibly the perfect landscape plant, it's adaptable to most soils, doesn't need pruning, and provides multi-season interest in the landscape! One just isn't enough, so use it for mass plantings and edging.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Native to North America - Tolerant of a wide range of soil, light, and moisture conditions; deer resistant - Much smaller than conventional aronias and suited to a variety of landscape applications - White flowers in spring, red-orange fall color, black fruits in late summer attract birds

Grower Tips:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Needs less trimming than other aronias (including Low Scape Hedger) to attain an attractive habit; trim much like you would boxwood. • Blooms on old wood; stop pruning in mid-summer before sale season to allow flower buds to form. • If fruit is desired for presentation, do not prune after blooming.

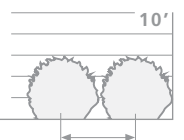

Grower Tips:
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Trim 3-4 times to build plant body.• Benefits from a dormant prune of a few inches off the top early in the spring prior to sale. If a subsequent trim must be done at the nursery before shipping, it should occur in late spring at the latest to allow flower buds to develop.• Panicle hydrangeas prefer to fill the container with roots before they put on top growth.• Somewhat susceptible to spider mites, scout often and treat aggressively. Avoid stress to minimize threat.• For late season sales, avoid drought stress to preserve good flower color.

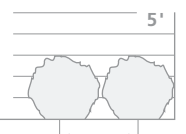

Grower Tips:

- All roses benefit from frequent light trimming, which produces an attractive habit and encourages abundant bloom.
- Will come out of winter fine in an unheated polyhouse; however, overwintering above freezing will help you ship in-bloom product earlier.
- May be cycle-pruned for a continuous supply of in-bloom product to ship; Allow 6-8 weeks after a trim for flower buds to form. Keep well-watered and fertilized.
- All Proven Winners roses are disease resistant in the landscape, but normal rose disease prevention methods – avoid overhead watering, clean up debris, etc. – are strongly recommended for the best crop.
- Watch for aphids and spider mites.
