## Grower Tips:

- Makes a good addition to fall color programs; can be potted and sold in the same season.
- Trim or shear plants as often as new growth permits to create a compact, dense plant. Stop trimming in late June to have plants in bloom for late season sales.
- Good drainage is imperative for success; grow much like you do buddleia.
- Avoid late season fertilizing and heavy watering in cold climates.
- Keep on the dry side during dormancy.
- Potting a 2 ¼" liner directly to a 3 gallon is not recommended.
