-	Dwarf red-twig dogwood with bright red stems developing in cold weather

-	Useful for mass plantings, hedges, specimens, rain gardens, and mixed borders; good for cuts and winter containers.

Grower Tips:	
•	Easy to grow and adaptable, but not tolerant of high heat and humidity.
•	Best color is seen on one and two year old stems
•	Trim up to three times to develop a full, rounded habit.
•	Practice good sanitation to reduce or eliminate fungal diseases (downy mildew, anthracnose, and leaf spot).
•	This is a dwarf variety that will finish in about the same time as other red-twig dogwood but will be a smaller plant.
