## **Grower Tips:**

- Blooms on old wood; stop pruning in mid-summer before year of sale to allow flower buds to form.
- Southern growers should site plants in part shade.
- Very few pests bother fothergilla if all cultural requirements are met.
- Excellent fall color can boost fall sales.
- Branching structure adds winter interest in the landscape.
- This adaptable plant can be sited full sun to partial shade; drought tolerant once established.
- Potting a 2 ¼" or 4" liner directly into a 2 or 3 gallon container is not recommended
