Grower Tips:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Hibiscus are very heavy feeders and benefit from supplemental foliar feeds. Pale green foliage indicates the need for increased nitrogen.</li> <li>• Trim to shape frequently to avoid cutting into thick, woody stems, as doing so will result in a slow recovery.</li> <li>• Allow 8-10 weeks after last trim for flower buds to form if same-season, in-bloom sales are desired. If overwintered before sale, a dormant prune improves shape.</li> <li>• Whiteflies and aphids are most likely pest problems, scout often.</li> <li>• Potting a 2 ¼" liner directly to a 3 gallon is not recommended.</li> </ul>
