Grower Tips:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Very fast to produce and easy to ship in bud and bloom. This dwarf variety will finish slightly smaller than other Let's Dance® hydrangeas. • Initial bloom will be on previous year's growth; rebloom occurs on new wood approximately 10-12 weeks later. • Trim lightly to shape as many times as possible until late July; Pruning or trimming after this will interfere with bud set for the following season. Dormant or spring pruning will also remove flower buds, though rebloom will still occur later. • All big-leaf hydrangeas bloom pink-red in growing media unless treated with aluminum sulfate. If you wish to sell big-leaf hydrangeas with blue flowers, please see our info sheet for a detailed look at the process. • May be susceptible to powdery mildew and leaf spot; grow with good air circulation and practice good sanitation to reduce disease.
