Grower Tips:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Flower buds are less susceptible to cold damage than <i>H. macrophylla</i>, but overwintering above freezing is recommended for shipping floriferous plants. • Timely pruning is essential for the plant to develop a well-branched, appealing body. Start trimming early in the season to ensure all pruning is done only on soft new growth. Do not cut into heavy wood as recovery will be slow. • Flower buds set on previous year's growth; stop trimming in late July to allow buds to set for sale the following season. • Growth rate starts slow but speeds considerably once root system has developed. • Susceptible to leaf spot – grow with good air circulation, avoid overhead watering, and practice good sanitation to minimize. • Good fall color can extend sales season into fall. Keep well-watered for best color to develop.
