- Berries will only develop before sale if the plant is allowed to flower (no dormant or spring prune) and if compatible male varieties are grown within the same range.
- Chlorosis may occur on undernourished plants or those grown in media with a neutral or high pH.
- Potting a 2 ¼" liner directly into a 3 gallon container is not recommended.
