Grower Tips:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Trim to shape as new growth allows – do not cut into thick stems. Follow plant's natural columnar habit.</li> <li>• Male variety, will not bear fruit. However, if using as a pollinator for a female crop, do not dormant or spring prune. Can be trimmed after flowering.</li> <li>• Chlorosis may occur on undernourished plants or those grown in media with a neutral or high pH.</li> <li>• Potting a 2 ¼" liner directly into a 3 gallon container is not recommended.</li> </ul>
