Grower Tips:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Production-wise, this can be treated much like a fast-growing boxwood.</li> <li>• Naturally dense and well-branched so does not require a great deal of pruning to produce a saleable plant.</li> <li>• Trim two to three times to shape; can be shaped as desired. Trim out any long, errant shoots that occur.</li> <li>• Flowers on old wood so dormant and spring pruning will remove the flowers, but they are not the primary selling point on this plant. They are fragrant, however, and may get extra notice at the garden center.</li> <li>• Can be grown in part shade, but best foliage color develops with a few weeks' exposure to full sun.</li> </ul>
