Features & Benefits:

- Yezberry[®] haskaps are better suited to warmer climates. They bloom a bit later than others.
- The most compact of any haskap; ideal for residential growing and containers.
- This variety must be pollinated by another Yezberry[®] variety, though both will then bear large, sweet fruits that can be eaten fresh off the plant.

Grower Tips:

- Blooms very early in the season dormant or spring pruning will remove flower buds and the potential for fruit.
 Trim 2-4 times the first season to develop an appealing, well-rounded form. Stop pruning in late July to allow the flower buds to form for sale the following season.
 This smaller variety will finish as quickly as other Yezberry[®] varieties but will be a smaller plant.
 Plants will most likely bloom before shipping season begins, and
- Plants will most likely bloom before shipping season begins, and flowers are relatively insignificant anyway. To ship product bearing fruit, grow near any other Yezberry[®] variety; all plants will then develop berries. Isolation is not necessary.
- This plant is susceptible to sunscald and should be grown with some shade. Powdery mildew may also occur; use all standard practices to minimize.
