Grower Tips:	
•	This plant flushes hard in the spring, after flowering, then rests for the summer and flushes hard once the heat breaks later in the season. Heavy prunes are not recommended during the growing season.
•	Tidy container plant with dark foliage and good flower coverage should be an easy sell at garden centers.
•	1-2 trims during the first growing season should create a well branched container.
•	Do not trim after July, as flowers form on old wood.
•	Dark green foliage is attractive throughout the summer.
•	This plant is extremely fragrant
