Fruit persists into autumn. - Native to North America, deer resistant

Grower Tips:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fast growing, especially for a viburnum, this plant has great potential for the landscape market and can be sold the same season if in-bloom plants are not required. • Blooms on old wood: dormant and spring pruning will remove flower buds and the potential for fruit. • To sell with fruit on it, it must be grown near All That Glows® viburnum to ensure pollination. • Trim 2-4 times to develop a well-branched plant that fills out container; stop pruning in late July to allow flower buds to form for the sales season. • Potting a 2 ¼" liner directly to a 3 gallon can is not recommended. • Somewhat susceptible to spider mites in production; scout and treat accordingly.
