Grower Tips:

- Vigorous and easy to grow, this plant has great potential for the landscape market. Can be sold the first season.
- Blooms through spring, but highly textured glossy foliage ensures interest at retail all season.
- Flowers are borne on old wood dormant and spring pruning will remove buds for the season. Stop trimming in late July to allow flower buds to form for sale the following season.
- Trim 3-4 times to create a dense plant. Trimming is important to prevent legginess in the container.
