<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Snowball viburnum with useful low-spreading habit. Perfect for edging or planting on walls. - Large lacecap-style flowers are arranged neatly on branches in spring, as is typical of the species. - Deer resistant and shade tolerant.

Grower Tips:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Though plant is hardy, we recommend overwintering slightly above freezing in the colder parts of the hardiness zone. Roots are slow to get established, and doing so will help you have a saleable plant sooner. • Blooms on old wood – dormant and spring pruning will remove flower buds for the season. • Dwarf plant finishes in about the same amount of time as other snowball viburnum but will be a smaller, broader plant. • This low-branching plant should not be sheared – just trim into soft growth up to 3 times to encourage dense growth. • Stop pruning in late July to allow flower buds to form for sale the following season. • Somewhat susceptible to spider mites – scout and treat according to your IPM protocol.
