## Tips:

- h weigela are fast to produce, this variety must be wintered-over if in-bloom shipping is required. For landscape or commercial sales, you can ship same-season if desired. Uniquely colorful foliage provides season-long appeal.
- Good rebloom; may be able to ship in late summer with flowers.
- Spring and dormant pruning will remove the first set of flower buds.
- Trim to shape frequently to produce a dense, compact plant that has longer retail appeal. Stop trimming in late July to allow flower buds to form for sale the following season.
- If not grown in high light, place plants in full sun for 2 weeks before sale to develop the best leaf color.
- Spider mites may become an issue; scout and treat as your IPM program dictates.
